Madame Chair, Distinguished Delegates,

I am honored to represent my country Micronesia and address this 58th session of the Commission on Population and Development with the theme of "Ensuring Healthy Lives and Promoting Well Being for all at all Ages".

As a Small Island Developing State (SIDS), Micronesia faces unique challenges and opportunities in addressing population and development issues. Our island nation is deeply committed to ensuring that our policies and programs reflect the principles of inclusivity, sustainability, and resilience.

Micronesia recognizes the critical importance of integrating population dynamics into sustainable development strategies. Our efforts are guided by the understanding that the well-being of our people is intrinsically linked to the health of our environment. As stewards of vast ocean territories, we emphasize the need for global cooperation to address the impacts of climate change and sea-level rise, which disproportionately affect our island nation and the health and lives of our population.

We reaffirm our commitment to promoting gender equality, empowering women and girls, and ensuring access to quality education and healthcare for all.
